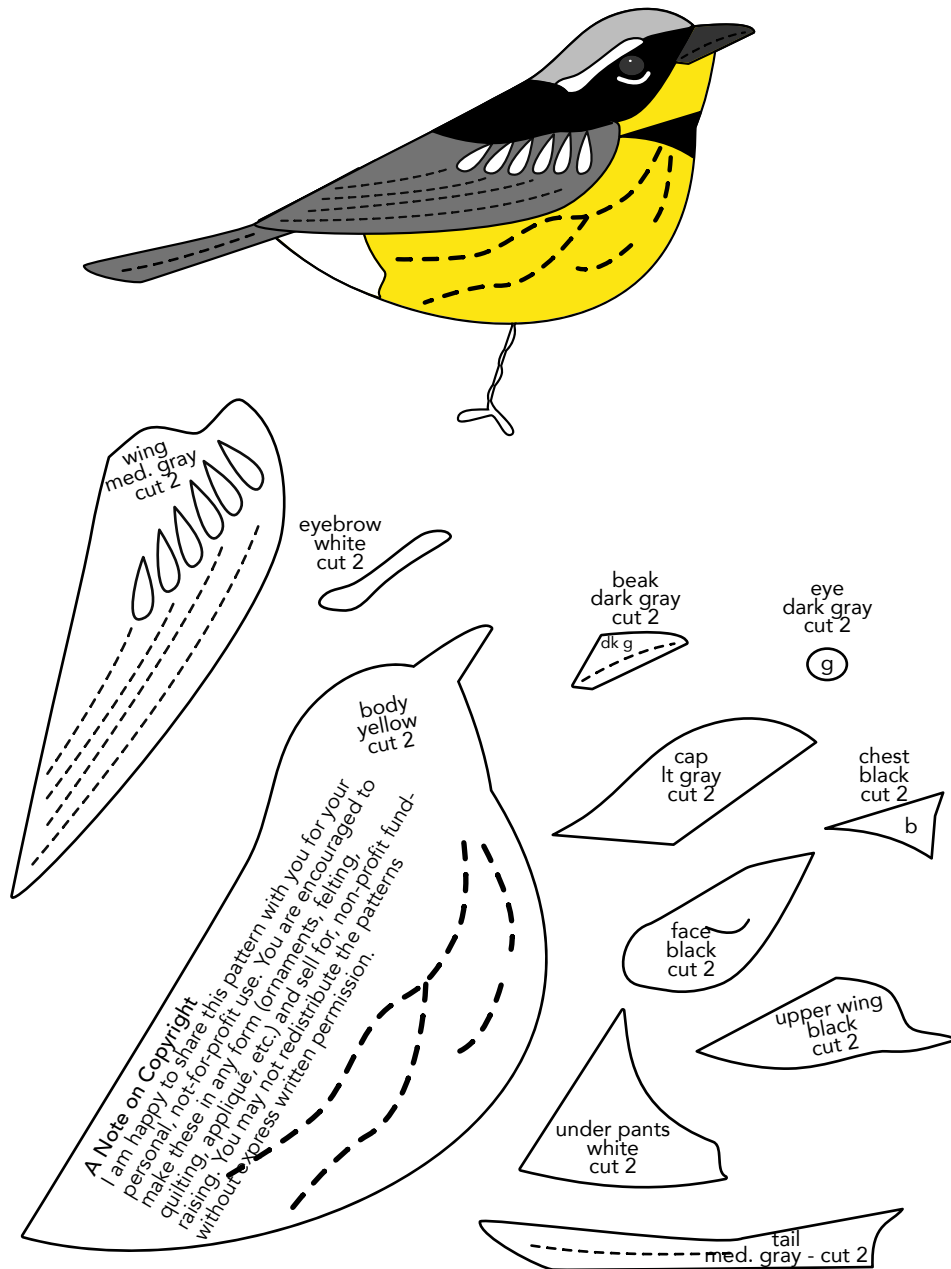


# Downeast Thunder Farm Magnolia Warbler

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- Create two mirror images for a double-sided bird. Use one strand of matching color floss unless specified.
- Position the cap and tack.
- Position the face and tack around the edges.
- Position the beak and tack with a running stitch for the mouth.
- Position the eye and tack with a black French knot or seed bead.
- Position the chest and tack.
- Position the tail and tack.
- Position the underpants and tack.
- Position the wing and tack. Position the upper wing and tack. Using four strands of white floss, add the lazy daisy stitches to the wing.
- With one strand of black floss, add the running stitches to the wing and tail.
- Add the white stitches under the eye. Tack the brows in place.
- With three strands of black floss, add the markings to the belly with a split stitch.
- If desired, tack the legs to the back of one of the bodies. Sew the two bodies together with a black blanket stitch, pausing to lightly stuff with fiberfill before finishing.
