


# Downeast Thunder Farm Common Yellowthroat Warbler

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Create mirror images of this bird for a double-sided ornament. Use one strand of floss unless otherwise noted.

- Position the throat and underpants. Tack with using white floss.
- Position the white face, tack with white floss. Position the black face and tack with black floss.
- Position eye and tack with a black seed bead. Position beak and tack with a black running stitch.
- Position the tail on the back of the body and tack.
- Position the wing and tack the inside edges with a brown running stitch using two strands of floss. Continue with two strands to add the decorative stitching to the wing and tail.
- On the back, tack legs formed from a piece of wire.
- Pin the body pieces together and sew with a blanket stitch using two strands of brown floss; pause before finishing lightly with fiberfill. Finish stitching and tie off.
