



Downeast Thunder Farm Mountain Lion

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- Position the muzzle on the face. Sew the black running stitch down the center. Position mouth, tack with a white running stitch. Add the black running stitch to define the mouth.
- Position the eye and tack with an amber seed bead or gold French knot.
- Position the head on the body. Tack with the brown running stitches on the left and right of the face. Position ears and tack with a couple of white stitches down the center.
- I gave you a pattern for the nose, but it's so tiny I opted to sew on the nose with a satin stitch. Add a few long black stitches for whiskers.
- Position the chest and tack with a white running stitch along the inside edge.
- Sew the brown running stitches on the body that define the legs. With black floss, add the stitches that define the toes. Repeat on the back of the other body.
- Sew the tail tip on the tail with black floss. Repeat on the other tail.
- Match up the tails and pin to the back of one body.
- Sew the two bodies and tails with a blanket stitch using two strands of matching golden-tan floss. Pause when you're about 1½" from finishing the blanket stitch. Lightly stuff with small bits of fiberfill; finish sewing the edge and tie it off.
