


Downeast Thunder Farm Sleepy Snowy Owl

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Supplies:

- White felt
- White faux fur trim
- White, gray, and black floss
- White pipe cleaners

Instructions:

- Cut out all of the pieces. When cutting the wing from the faux fur, trace the pattern on the fur back in pencil making sure the fur goes the direction you want when turned back over. Cut the wing from the faux fur using an exacto blade, cutting just through the backing.
- Tack the wing onto the body, holding the fur away from the edge, catching the needle just on the edge of the backing, and being careful not to capture the fur in the floss. Sew a whip stitch around the edges.
- With two strands of black floss, sew the eyes with two rows of back stitches. Alternatively, you could sew on circles of black felt or buttons for the eyes.
- Sew the beak by outlining the triangle with three strands of gray floss and then fill in with a satin stitch.
- Using two strands of white floss, sew the "v" patterns on the wing body.
- If making a double-sided ornament, repeat all steps on the body back minus the eyes and beak.
- Sew the bodies together with a blanket stitch using two strands of white floss. Stop about 2" before finishing and stuff with fiberfill. Cut the pipe cleaner in half and create a loop at the top. Tuck in it between the fiberfill and body back with the end sticking out the bottom of the owl where you want the legs to be. Finish the blanket stitch and tie off. Curl the pipe cleaner.
